- Women's Health East together with the Eastern Metropolitan Region Regional Family Violence Partnership (RFVP) and WDVCS have developed this project.
- Sixteen women have been trained to be volunteer advocates.

Advocates can provide personal insights on the impact of sexual assault and family violence, challenge many of the commonly held beliefs around sexual assault and family violence; can correct misconceptions and stereotypes about victims; and can support the Victorian Government and Victorian Police in ensuring that perpetrators be held accountable. Advocates can also provide information about where can women go for support.

Engage your audience, key stakeholders and the wider community by having a survivor of sexual assault and family violence speak at your event.
